

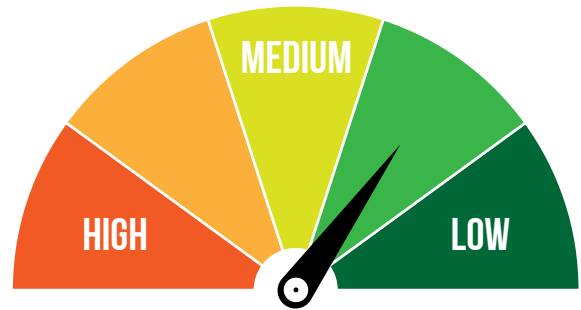
# OPTIONS TO VISIT LOVED ONES SAFELY

We recognize that our residents and families have a wide variety of comfort levels with how much risk they are willing to take on contracting the virus and spreading it to a loved one. These decisions are difficult to navigate, especially when **our residents are among the most vulnerable to the virus**, so we want you to understand your options.

Please understand that those who are vaccinated are still at low risk for contracting and spreading the virus to others - the vaccines are not 100% effective.

We ask that you carefully consider the following options for visiting your loved ones, from highest to lowest risk:

### Other Reminders about Visits:

- Wear a surgical or N95 mask as directed
- Use hand sanitizer upon arrival
- Bring proof of COVID-19 vaccination or negative result (within last 72 hours if available)



## HIGH RISK

- **Essential Caregivers & Compassionate Care Visitors (with a Non-Vaccinated Resident)**
- **Voluntary Leave of Absence (for a Non-Vaccinated Resident)**
- **Scheduled Indoor Visit with a Non-Vaccinated Resident**

*A Voluntary Leave of Absence Agreement allows residents to visit loved ones in their homes. All visits with non-vaccinated residents must occur in a designated visiting area where physical distancing can be maintained.*

## MEDIUM RISK

- **Essential Caregivers & Compassionate Care Visitors (with a Vaccinated Resident)**
- **Voluntary Leave of Absence (for a Vaccinated Resident)**
- **Scheduled Indoor Visit with a Vaccinated Resident**
- **Scheduled Outdoor Visit with a Non-Vaccinated Resident**

*Indoor and Outdoor Visit availability may vary based on the community's exposure level or positivity rate.*

## LOW RISK

- **Virtual Visits**
- **Window Visits**

*The safest way to visit your loved one is virtually or with a window visit. These visits can be scheduled by calling the community directly.*
